Baldwin County Awarded Land Water Conservation Grant for New Aquatic Center

The Georgia Department of Natural Resources announced on August 23, 2023 that Baldwin County has been selected for a \$447,008 Land Water Conservation Fund Grant.

This grant will support construction of Phase 2 of the Baldwin County Aquatic Center. This will allow the county to build Phases 1 and 2 at the same time.

The Baldwin County Aquatic Center will be open to the public with a moderate entrance fee and will house a large pool, lazy river, water slides, a splash pad, as well as a picnic area and pavilion. Located near Walter B. Williams Recreation Park, the aquatic center will provide a fun environment for children and families as well as teens, adults, and seniors of Baldwin County.

Allenwood Storm Drain Pipe Replacement Complete


All the storm drain pipes have been replaced in the Allenwood Subdivision. The county had been replacing all cracked and narrow pipes in the neighborhood.
