Senator Ossoff Delivering Resources to Strengthen Economic Development in Baldwin County





U.S. Senator Jon Ossoff is delivering new resources to upgrade the Sibley Place Industrial Park in Milledgeville, the newest Industrial Park in Baldwin County. With 1,500 acres and rail access served by Norfolk Southern, this conveniently located site allows for almost unlimited possibilities. The funding

will provide sewer infrastructure to the industrial park, which is key to the park's continued growth. With current water and new sewer infrastructure, the park will be equipped to attract new economic development projects and companies, creating more job opportunities for families.

The park is set to begin development in phases and can put manufacturers in a competitive location that allows for easy access to rail and roads with plenty of space to accommodate a multitude of industries. The Sibley Place Industrial Park also provides enough space to buffer advanced manufacturers from encroachment, leaving plenty of opportunity for future expansion.

Senator Ossoff brought Republicans and Democrats together to deliver \$1.1 million for the project through this year's bipartisan government funding package. "I remain focused on expanding economic opportunities for Georgia families in every corner of our state," Sen. Ossoff said. "I thank Chairman John H. Westmoreland and the Baldwin County Commission for bringing this proposal to my office and for their leadership in the community."

Experimental Aircraft Association's Chapter 1685 Hosts Two Local Events for Youth





The new Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) Chapter 1685, based at the Baldwin County Regional Airport, sponsored two significant and very worthy events during its Aviation Spring Weekend in April. On Friday April 19th, "My Story in Army Aviation" was presented by U.S. Army Special Operations Aviation flight leader Chief Warrant Officer 5 (Ret) Doug Englen, who planned and led the air mission for Operation Neptune Spear, the May 2011 raid on Osama bin Laden's compound in Pakistan. At the time of his retirement, Doug was the most decorated pilot on active duty in all the Services.

The presentation took place at Georgia Military College's Goldstein Theater to the GMC Corps of Cadets and community members. Doug Englen presented first-hand details of the raid on Osama bin Laden's compound and took questions from a very interested audience. On Saturday, the EAA Chapter sponsored its first Young Eagles Rally, providing free introductory 'discovery' airplane rides to local youth, ages 8 to 17. The rides were given by EAA Chapter pilots using their own time and aircraft to give the kids the thrill of their young lives and stimulate their interest in careers in aviation. Thirty individuals signed up online to participate – filling the available spaces in a matter of hours after the official opening. The children were taken aloft for a twenty-minute introductory ride over Lake Sinclair and downtown Milledgeville. After the aircraft landed, big smiles were abundant on both the parents and the young participants.


