

Georgia Awards Baldwin County \$1.25 Million Community Development Block Grant

Baldwin County CDBG 2024 Target Area



Georgia Department of Community Affairs Commissioner Christopher Nunn announced on August 28th that 36 Georgia communities have been awarded more than \$33.4 million in federal grants to support their communities. Baldwin County is to receive \$1.25 million.

Baldwin County is the only county that received a multiactivity grant. One million dollars will be spent to upgrade the sewer system and roughly \$250,000 will be spent to rehabilitate three homes.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development allocates these funds annually to Georgia's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program, which is administered by the Georgia Department of Community Affairs (DCA). Georgia's CDBG program is available to non-entitlement local governments and specifically targets rural communities.

After a competitive and thorough evaluation process, applications are scored, rated, and ranked. Grants are awarded based on overall merit.

"Community Development Block Grants provide rural Georgians with improved access to resources that enhance their infrastructure, community facilities, and overall quality of life," said Commissioner Nunn. "It is always an honor to help our rural communities whenever possible."

Chairman John L. Westmoreland said, "I am extremely proud of the team effort required to acquire a Community Development Block Grant. The program is highly competitive, and I am grateful Baldwin County was awarded the grant to make necessary infrastructure improvements. As a Georgia Initiative for Community Housing community, Baldwin County is now eligible for a CDBG annually. However, that comes with the requirement for our staff and consultants to work diligently and quickly to deliver these projects to be eligible for the next round. I know they are up to the task and will be glad to support them as they start this journey right away."

Commissioner Davis stated, "I am proud that we can continue to help our citizens improve their lifestyle and self-esteem. The repairs to their homes will make them safer. The sewer system upgrades are much needed on Vinson Highway, Thompson and Marion Streets."

"Through the long-term vision of the Baldwin County staff, the aging infrastructure of our county continues to be modernized into dependable sewer systems that will continue to support our community families for future generations. That county vision now includes opportunities to address and improve aging housing and address blight across Baldwin County. I am very pleased that several homes in our community will be given resources to improve quality of life for our citizens. These increased opportunities to improve our infrastructure and community housing is a result of the Baldwin County Staff and Commissioners participating in federal and state programs that are designed for local governments that are dedicated to improving their community. Few counties in Georgia received the level of support that Baldwin County received," shared Commissioner Craig.


